TEAM REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

A.H.A.U.S.

Team membership forms may be obtained from the District Registrar or Sub Registrars listed on page 9.

Type or print, and mail three parts of the completed form and check (see fees on page 9) to District Registrar. Retain the fourth copy for club records.

Paid Gate teams will also be charged 2% of their gate after taxes. Reports must be filed monthly with Registrar for forwarding to National office.

Upon receipt of the completed application one copy will be forwarded to the National office. The team representative listed on the form will receive a Rule Book, A.H.A.U.S. Guide, and a A.A.H.A. Guide. He will also receive a subscription to *Hockey Biz* magazine.

The Players Registration Form (also referred to as Player Roster) must be filled out in full and returned to the District Registrar. Players registered on a Paid Gate team must complete individual player registration form.

When the proper completed player form is returned to the District Registrar, each player will be issued an individual helmet decal through his team representative.

Team registration forms must be in the possession of the District Registrar by **December 31, 1980.**

Player registration forms (player rosters) must be in the possession of the District Registrar no later than **December 31, 1980.** They must be complete and signed by each individual player.

A.H.A.U.S. insurance is available only to registered teams, and this means all the teams of any given club must be registered.

DO'S AND DON'TS FOR DISTRICT TOURNAMENT BOUND TEAMS

DO complete Team Registration form before playing first game.

DO NOT play any non-registered team at any time.

DO complete the Player Roster form and get it into the hands of the Registrar by December 31, 1980.

BE sure to play, and have signed score sheets by registered A.H.A.U.S. officials to show that you have played twenty (20) games against registered A.H.A.U.S. teams.

EVERY player on the roster must have played in at least ten (10) of those games.

ALL teams of your Club or organization must be registered for any one team to be eligible for tournament play.

DO NOT play in or host non-sanctioned tournaments—contact Registrar for information.

USE A.H.A.U.S. officials for all games.

CHECK availability of birth certificates and accuracy of age early in the season to avoid surprises at tournament time.

NO A.H.A.U.S. Player Registration (Rosters) form changes may be made after December 31st.

EACH team must have two **GOALIES** dressed and ready to play in every tournament game.

BRING insurance certificate to District tournament site showing team coverage.

DO NOT allow any of your rostered players to participate on non-registered teams.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The A.A.H.A. has a dual thrust in our activities to support amateur hockey. First, we actively support anything which will make recreation hockey more available and more enjoyable. The District House League Tournament, the A.H.A. film "I'd Rather Play Hockey" and personal appearances at local rinks of past and present NHL stars are several of the programs which we support. We are also doing our best to meet with ice hockey rink managers and point out the maximum profitability of recreation hockey, particularly in their off hours.

The other larger area of our thrust is developmental hockey where we are doing everything that we can to help the above average participant develop his ability to the maximum and aid him in continuing on into College Division 1, 2 and 3 hockey and even professional hockey. In other words, we are helping hockey to aid our better players in obtaining a higher education.

Many of our activities in aiding developmental hockey, unfortunately, are easily misunderstood by many people. Since hockey coaches inform us that one of the most important ingredients in improving the ability of a player is his participating against competition which is as good or better than he is. In Minnesota, Massachusetts and Michigan there is a high saturation of competitive hockey players making the matching of the best against the best an easily obtained objective. Unfortunately, in our area the only way this objective can be met, due to our low density of hockey participation, is through the structuring of competition under leagues and with some increased travel commitments. Fortunately, this structured league play is also more enjoyable for the average participant. Unfortunately, the adult hockey community finds many reasons for resisting this goal. Therefore, in order to encourage the attainment of this goal we have limited the eligibility of our District Tournaments to successful league teams and designated tier I and II leagues to further refine competition and permitting the tier I league to send the most participants into our District Tournaments to encourage the strong teams to join the strongest league rather than the weakest league for the easiest route to the Districts.

Tier I hockey with increased travel, number of games and practices becomes very expensive. Obviously, we must therefore do everything which we can to make the best use of the hockey dollar and obtain both team and individual sponsorship to allow the players with the greatest ability to pursue their talents regardless of their families financial status. Anyone in this District, regardless of how good they believe their intentions to be who actively attempts to limit financial subsidization, is guilty of acts detrimental to developmental hockey.

We are also doing everything that we can to bring attention to the top level hockey players which we have participating in our District that are the equal of those produced anywhere. So they may get the opportunity that their ability entitles them to participate, at the college level. To this end we are publishing the successful activities of these players in college and professional hockey.

HISTORY OF A.A.H.A.

The states of New Jersey, Delaware, and Pennsylvania were associated at various times with New York's District II, A.H.A.U.S., and the Mid-America District. In all cases we were merely an appendage and never an integral part.

Therefore, in the Spring of 1972, with Dr. Earl F. Hoerner (Livingston Hockey Club) and Lester Dodson (Bergen-Rockland Hockey Club) as prime movers, meetings and activities were generated to set up our own organization and to petition A.H.A.U.S. to so recognize our group. Following a May 1972 Ad Hoc Committee meeting in Princeton, N.J., attended by about twenty representatives from New Jersey and Philadelphia Area Clubs, Doc Hoerner and Les Dodson attended the A.H.A.U.S. General Meeting in Chicago with the result that the Mid-Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association was officially chartered as District IV, A.H.A.U.S. in June 1972.

In the first year the strong influence of the Livingston, Bergen-Rockland and the Philadelphia Little Flyer clubs molded a viable organization with Dr. Hoerner as President, Lester Dodson the A.H.A.U.S. District IV Registrar and Jim Measday as the Secretary/Treasurer, later taking over as A.H.A.U.S. Registrar in 1974. The good Doctor also was elected to a directorship of the National Organization and Chairman of its first Safety and Protective Equipment Committee.

Our District Tournaments are one of the highlights of each season with our winners moving on to a Regional Tournament against the Mid-America and Southeastern Districts comprising seventeen states, and then to the A.H.A.U.S. National Championships where we have always done well, particularly so when our Junior Rockets won the Junior B National Championship in April 1978 defeating an All-Star aggregation from Los Angeles after disposing of teams from Michigan and Minnesota among others. The same Junior Rockets won the National Championship in March 1980 after being runner-up in April 1979.

"Doc" Hoerner was our President and A.H.A.U.S. Director until he moved to Massachusetts in 1977. Ernie Anastasio of Princeton then took over those duties. Doc had molded us into a viable organization, well organized nationally, and Ernie continued the same high ideals until business concerns forced him to resign near the end of his first term of office.

In May 1978 Ken Gesner of Ridgewood, N.J. was elected to the Presidency and also to the A.H.A.U.S. Directorship, and a new era began for the District. The accent was on League strength and buildup, new Zone delineation so that all groups would be represented on the Board of Directors. District Tournaments were instituted for House League and "B" level teams with the same awards going to those winners and runners-up as to the Open winners.

Girls hockey got underway in the 1976-77 season and at least one representative from our District has participated in the Girls National each winter.

Gray Bryan was our Referee-In-Chief for the first several seasons and then Vin Godleski of Califon, N.J. took over that leadership and retains it to this day. Each season every on-ice official must attend one of the many clinics run by Vin and his team, and in addition each man is re-evaluated every season. Three of our young men have moved into the Pro ranks which is the ultimate compliment of Vin's program.

Last season Jim Shute, late of the Little Flyers, came back on board and took over as the District's Chief Coaching Instructor. His efforts and clinics have outdone anything else attempted through A.H.A.U.S. This Fall he is again underway with clinics being held geographically within the District.

And lastly, The Atlantic Hockey Association continues in great admiration and debt to the "Big" Philadelphia Flyers and their owner Ed Snider for their third season of funding Hockey Central in Villanova, Pa. Aaron Seigel, a V.P. of the Spectrum, oversees the activities of this youth hockey service bureau in which Mary Shute is the Executive Secretary and Andy Abramson the Executive Director. The great efforts of Hockey Central cannot be adequately described, but it does show the recognition by the professional hockey organizations that more and more team rosters will be filled by American boys coming up through the youth hockey programs of A.H.A.U.S. and the Atlantic District.

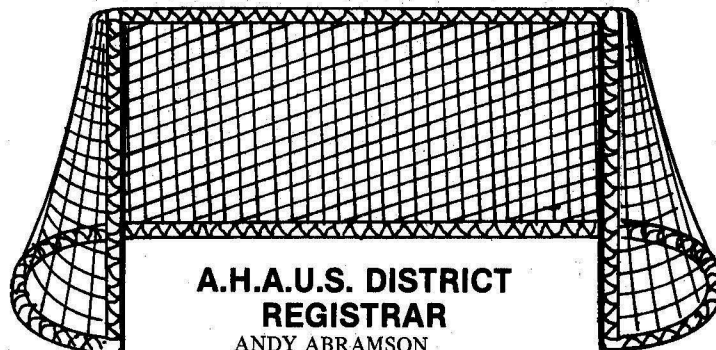

To be eligible for District Tournaments the team must have played twenty (20) games against A.H.A.U.S. registered teams and each boy on the roster must have appeared in ten (10) of those games. See Bylaws, Rules and Regulations.

All teams and players shall be registered prior to the start of exhibition or league play.

A team may register and play up to 18 skaters and 2 goalies.

RENEWAL REGISTRANTS—Will receive an Application Form automatically from the District Referee-in-Chief.

NOTE: Referee registration begins September 1 and ends June 30 of the following year. To be eligible to officiate in any State, District, Regional Playoffs or National Championships an official must be registered on or before December 31 of the current season. Applications are due in by November 15 and tests are due in by December 15.

ALL APPLICANTS (New and Renewal)—The properly completed application shall be returned to the District Referee-in-Chief with a check in the proper amount.

You will then receive a current A.H.A.U.S. Rule Book, Rules Examination and Answer Sheet.

Return the properly completed **Answer Sheet** for grading.

If the minimum grade requirements (Approved—40; Accredited—135; Certified—140) are obtained the District Referee-in-Chief will review the application and determine the proper classification for the applicant.

If an excess amount of money was submitted it will be refunded.

If the minimum grade was not obtained the exam may be taken again.

Upon acceptance of the application all Referees will receive an Official A.H.A.U.S. Referee's Manual, Sweater Crest and Registration Card for the current season.

REFEREE CLINICS

Keeping skills and techniques sharp and knowledge of the rules current is essential for all good Referees. Attending an A.H.A.U.S. Clinic is the best way to do this. Attendance at an Official A.H.A.U.S. Clinic is mandatory for registration for the 1980-81 season as it was last year.

Go left at light on Route 59 - two lights. 2nd light is College Road on your left. Nanuet National Bank is on the corner. Go left on College Road about 1,000 feet - rink entrance is on your right.

FROM NEW YORK CITY & LONG ISLAND: Take New York State Thruway over Tappan Zee Bridge to Exit 14B - Airmont Rd. Follow directions given above.

UNIVERSITY OF DELAWARE ICE ARENA

Interstate 95 Newark (University of Delaware exit) Rt. 896 North to Univ. of Del. Field House left behind Field House is rink.

UPPER MERION YMCA

Penna. Tpke. to Valley Forge Exit 24, Pickup Rt. 202 north (exit 26N) North on Rt. 202 to Henderson Rd. Left on Henderson Rd. to Rt. 23. Left on Rt. 23 to rink on left.

VALLEY FORGE RINK (Valley Forge, Pa.)

Penna. Tpke. to Exit 24. Take Route 202 South about 2 miles to Paoli Exit. Take Route 252 toward Paoli to first traffic light. Turn right and go about a block. Rink entrance is on the left.

WARINCO RINK (Elizabeth, NJ)

Garden State Pkwy. to exit 137. Go East toward Elizabeth 5 traffic lights to Phillips Station. Turn right onto Linden Rd. Go 5 blocks South to rink on right.

WESTTOWN (Westtown, Pa.)

Take New Jersey Tpke. to the Penna. Tpke. Exit. Go across the bridge to the Penn. Tpke. Get off the Penn. Tpke at the Valley Forge Exit. Follow to Rt. 202 South. Go on Route 202 until you see the signs for the three exits for Westchester. Take the second exit which is Rt. 3 East. Go on Rt. 3 East about 5 miles. The rink is on the right side of the road.

WILMINGTON

Penna. Tpke. to King of Prussia. Pickup Rt. 202 south (exit 26s) Take 202 south into Delaware. Left on Rt. 261 to Weldon Rd. Right on Weldon Rd. to drive into golf course to rink.

WINTER SPORTS ICE ARENA

Penn. Turnpike to Exit 27 (Willow Grove) south on 611 to Fitzwatertown Rd. (which is 2nd light) left on Fitzwatertown Rd. to Rt. 263 (York Rd.) (Bowling Alley on right) turn right. Rink 1/2 mi. on left behind Gino's.

WINTER WONDERLAND

Garden State Parkway Exit 30 - Ocean City - Right onto Ocean City Causway to 9th St. to Atlantic Ave. left on Atlantic to 6th St. right to Boardwalk rink in front of you.

WISSAHICKON

**BYLAWS
and
RULES AND REGULATIONS
of the
ATLANTIC AMATEUR HOCKEY ASSOCIATION
BYLAWS**

Article I — Name

1. The name of this Association shall be "Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association."

Article II — Location

2. The location of the principal office of this Association shall be the address of its Secretary.

Article III — Status

3. This Association shall have perpetual succession, shall have no capital stock, and shall not be conducted for pecuniary profit. As a non-profit organization regulating amateur hockey in Delaware, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, this Association, its Officers, Directors and Officials assume no responsibility for injury or damages to players under any circumstances.

Article IV — Purposes

4. The purposes of this Association are:
 - A. To develop and encourage sportsmanship between all players for the betterment of their physical and social well-being.
 - B. To encourage and improve the standard of ice hockey in the States of New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Delaware.
 - C. To associate with other ice hockey associations.
 - D. To conduct ice hockey tournaments and to select representative teams for other tournaments.
 - E. To do any and all acts desirable in the furtherance of the foregoing purposes.

Article V — Jurisdiction

5. This Association shall have full and final jurisdiction over all hockey and related activities taking place within the geographical boundaries designated by A.H.A.U.S., and of the hockey and related activities of those affiliations belonging to this Association. It is recognized, however, that various scholastic and collegiate, and those other associations (to the extent approved by this Association) may have other interrelated rules which may supplement and/or differ from A.A.H.A. and A.H.A.U.S. This Association respects the autonomy of these associations and their right to establish and administer rules that shall apply to the teams under their jurisdiction.

Article VI — Membership

6. In addition to the duly elected and appointed officers and members of the Board of Directors, the membership of this Association shall be comprised of the following:
 - A. Organized ice hockey league officers.
 - B. Independent teams not playing in any affiliated league.
 - C. Teams playing in organized leagues.
 - D. Registered coaches and team officials of teams qualified as members.
 - E. A.H.A.U.S. Officials (Directors, Referees, Officers).
 - F. A.A.H.A. Officers and Directors.
 - G. Associate and Affiliate members are accepted by the Board of Directors.

Article VII — Officers

7. The officers of this Association shall be: President, Executive Vice-President, Second Vice-President (Rules and Regulations), Third Vice-President (Protest, Suspensions and Appeals), Secretary and Treasurer.

- A. The officers shall be elected to office by the Board of Directors by a simple majority vote.
- B. The officers shall be elected for two year terms; the President, Second Vice-President and Treasurer being elected to their office on odd-numbered years and the remaining officers being elected on even-numbered years.
- C. Vacancies in the elected offices shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors. The appointee need not be a member of the Board of Directors. The appointment shall be for the remaining portion of the term of the vacated office.

8. The duties of the President shall include:

A. Presiding at all meetings.

B. Performing such duties usual to the office of President including:

(1) The power to call special meetings of this Association at his discretion.

(2) The power to determine questions arising from emergencies not provided for in the rules, regulations or bylaws, until such time as they may be acted upon by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting.

(3) The right to attend and represent the Association in other ice hockey meetings.

9. In the absence of the President, the Executive Vice-President shall have all the powers, attend to the responsibilities and perform all of the duties of the President and act in concert with him. In the absence of the President and Executive Vice President, the Second and Third Vice-President shall have their powers, responsibilities and duties.

A. The Second Vice-President shall be responsible for all interpretations of the Rules and Regulations and shall introduce proposed rule changes.

B. The Third Vice-President shall be responsible for Protests, Suspension and Appeals matters.

10. The Treasurer of the Association shall have the responsibility for receiving all funds due the Association, depositing them in a chartered bank, and paying the rightful obligations of the Association. He shall also have all other duties usually associated with position of Treasurer including the following:

A. Shall receive all registration fees for membership in the Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association and see that such fees are deposited in the Association's account.

B. Shall sign the checks on the Association's account.

C. Shall render the annual Treasurer's report and account to the A.H.A.U.S.

11. The Secretary shall appropriately advise the Officers, members of the Board of Directors and membership of meetings and other important information, publish and maintain the Minutes of the Annual and Semi-Annual meetings, and of the Board of Directors meetings.

Article VIII — Board of Directors

12. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the duly elected officers, the A.H.A.U.S. appointed Registrar, Referee-in-Chief and Chief Instructor, the elected Directors-at-Large, Zone Directors and Directors Emeritus.
13. A Director Emeritus shall be a lifetime member of the Board of Directors with authority but no responsibility to attend meetings. Directors Emeritus shall be those members nominated by a majority of the Board of Directors and elected by the membership-at-large at the Annual Meeting. They shall be nominated on the basis of their significant contributions to youth hockey and to this Association. The quorum requirement will not be affected by the Director Emeritus.
14. Individual Directors-at-Large and Alternates shall represent Rink Owners and Officials, each one being elected in person at the Annual Meeting by those representing such entities. They shall be elected to serve a term of one (1) year.
15. The right to vote at the Board of Directors meeting shall be limited to one vote for each of the following: Officers, Directors-at-Large, Directors Emeritus, Zone Directors, A.H.A.U.S. Directors and Registrar, the Referee Representative, Referee-in-Chief and Chief Instructor. No proxy voting is permitted. No individual serving in more than one capacity shall be entitled to more than one vote.
16. The powers and duties of the Board shall be:
 - A. To fill any vacancies which may occur in the Officers. Appointees need not be Members of the Board.

- B. To study and report to the Annual Meeting proposals to amend or revise the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations.
 - C. To act upon any temporary ruling by the President on emergencies not provided for in the Rules, Regulations or Bylaws.
 - D. To hear and rule on appeals.
17. Requirements of the Board shall be:
- A. Quorum: One-third of the total Directors (including officers) must be present in person to constitute a quorum of the Board of Directors of this Association. The quorum requirement will not be affected by Directors Emeritus.
 - B. Attendance: Any officer or other member of the Board of Directors unable to attend a meeting shall so communicate to the President, Executive Vice-President or Secretary, preferably in writing, and state the reason for his absence. If a Director is absent from two consecutive meetings, or from three meetings a year (including the Annual or Semi-Annual meetings) for reasons which the Board declares to be insufficient, his resignation shall be deemed to have been tendered and accepted.

Article IX—Zones

18. The duly constituted zones of this Association shall be as follows:

Zone I	Atlantic Hockey League
Zone II	New Jersey Youth Hockey League
Zone III	Delaware Valley Hockey League
Zone IV	New Jersey Independents
Zone V	Eastern Pennsylvania and Delaware Valley Independents
Zone VI	New Jersey High School (<i>High School registered teams</i>)
Zone VII	Pennsylvania High School (<i>High School registered teams</i>)
Zone VIII	Delaware High School (<i>High School registered teams</i>)
Zone IX	Mid Atlantic Women's Hockey League
Zone X	New Jersey House League
Zone XI	Pennsylvania/Delaware House League

19. Zone Elections:

- A. The District shall hold Zone elections no later than March 31st each year for the purpose of electing Directors and Alternates to serve a one year term.
- B. Each registered team in a Zone shall be permitted one vote. No team representative shall be permitted to represent more than one team. Only those teams registered as of December 31st of the current year shall be permitted to vote in Zone elections.
- C. Based on present season's registrations of teams, as of January 1st of that year, a Zone shall elect one Director with 30 teams, two Directors with 31-60 teams, three Directors with 61-90 teams, four Directors with more than 90 teams. There shall be as many Alternate Directors as there are Directors.
- D. Zone election voting shall be cumulative. There shall be no proxy voting. The Director receiving the largest number of votes shall be Chairman, and he shall see that the responsibilities for that Zone are carried out. Alternate Directors may act as substitute directors, and are appointed to fill vacancies in the number of Zone Directors of each Zone. The order of appointment shall be in accordance with the number of votes received in the Zone elections.
- E. Cumulative Voting is a system of voting, by which the elector, having a number of votes equal to the number of Directors to be chosen, is allowed to concentrate the whole number of his votes upon one person, or to distribute them as he may see fit. For example, if ten Directors are to be elected, then, under the system, the voter may cast ten votes for one person, or five votes for each of two persons, etc. It is intended to secure representation of a minority.
- F. All registered teams of the Zone must receive actual notice of the forthcoming elections for Zone Directors. Consistent with the Bylaws of this organization, the Zone Chairman shall have the responsibility for setting the time and place and conduct of the meeting. Written notice of the meeting shall precede the meeting date by no less than two weeks, with copies of the notice going to the President, Secretary and Executive Vice-President of A.A.H.A. and the incumbent Zone Directors of that Zone.

- G. In Zone elections, representatives not registered with the election meeting Chairman at the time of the close of nominations will not be permitted to vote. Only those team representatives appearing on the official registration shall be entitled to represent that team at elections or meetings called by A.A.H.A., except that said representatives may designate an alternate if the representative submits in writing to the A.A.H.A. Secretary, the name of the alternate not less than 72 hours in advance of the election or meeting.

- H. In the absence of zone elections by March 31st or other vacancies during te year, the President shall have the power to appoint Directors and/or Alternates.

20. Duties and Responsibilities of Zone Directors:

- A. Zone Directors are to attend Board of Directors and General Membership meetings.
- B. Contact and assist all teams and organizations and, where possible, attend meetings of the member organizations in order to conduct educational programs. In part, the educational programs should include such aspects of A.A.H.A. and A.H.A.U.S. rules relating to (a) use of A.H.A.U.S. referees, (b) prohibition against playing unregistered teams, (c) prohibition against playing foreign teams without prior approval by the District Registrar, (d) twenty-game for team and ten-game for player eligibility requirements, (e) score sheet requirements, (f) age validation and club responsibilities related thereto, (g) age classifications, (h) written reports of all offical actions taken between Board of Directors meetings, (i) zone election procedures, (j) procedures relating to suspensions and appeals.
- C. Seek-out non-registered teams located in their zones and encourage such teams to register their team with A.A.H.A.
- D. Encourage and assist in the formation and participation of organized leagues.
- E. Develop and encourage participation of club leaders to become active in A.A.H.A. activities.
- F. Zone Director Chairmen shall call regular and frequent meetings with the registered teams for purposes of education and communication, and membership awareness of current A.H.A.U.S. and A.A.H.A. happenings.

Article X—Committees

- 21. The following shall be permanent committees, each headed by a Chairman appointed by the President and approved by a majority of the Officers: (a) Tournaments Committee, (b) Communications, (c) Long Range Planning Committee, (d) Nominating Committee. (Board Meetings are open to attendance by Committee Chairmen.) Each Committee shall include the President and a Vice-President as voting members of the committee.
- 22. Duties and Responsibilities:
 - A. The Tournaments Committee Chairman shall oversee and be responsible for District tournaments to assure all teams of equal treatment and to appoint any local tournament committees. He shall serve on any Regional or National Tournament Committees held within the A.A.H.A. jurisdiction. He shall advise, in writing, each qualified team and/or league of the requirements for participation in District Tournaments.
 - B. The Nominating Committee shall make nominations at the Annual Meetings.

Article XI—District Membership Meetings

- 23. The Annual Meeting shall be held no later than the third (3rd) Saturday of May. The time, date and place to be designated by the President and communicated by the Secretary. Written notice by the Secretary, including a proposed agenda for the meeting, shall precede the meeting date by no less than three (3) weeks.
- 24. A Semi-Annual Meeting will be held in September of each year. Written notice, which includes an agenda for the meeting, shall precede the meeting date no less than three (3) weeks.
- 25. All items to be placed on the agenda for the Annual and the Semi-Annual Meetings shall be communicated to the Secretary, in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to the date set for said meetings.

26. Special meetings may be called by the President at any time, providing at least two (2) weeks notice if given.
27. One vote at the Annual Meeting shall be permitted to:
 - A. Each member of the Board of Directors of this Association.
 - B. Each registered team playing in competition in the District shall be permitted one vote. No team representative shall be permitted to represent more than one team. No proxy votes shall be permitted.
28. Only duly authorized representatives of registered teams may vote.
29. In all meetings a majority vote will carry a motion.
30. The President or Presiding Officer shall vote only to break a tie.
31. The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows, unless changed at the meeting:
 - A. Roll call and proof of notice.
 - B. Minutes of previous meeting.
 - C. Treasurer's report.
 - D. Report on previous year's activities and committee reports.
 - E. Unfinished business.
 - F. New business, including changes to these Rules.
 - G. Awarding of tournaments and setting of dates.
 - H. Election of Directors-at-Large.
 - I. Presentation of awards.
 - J. Selection of time and site for next Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings.
 - K. Adjourn.

32. The A.A.H.A. Director to A.H.A.U.S. shall be elected at the odd year Annual Meeting after being nominated by the Board of Directors. He shall serve a two year term.

Article XII — Amendments

33. These articles may be amended or changed at the Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting.
34. Each proposed change, addition or deletion may first be discussed in the Directors Meeting held prior to the Annual Meeting, regarding the merits of the proposal. The proposal will then be voted upon by the Directors and Officers whether or not to recommend its adoption to the Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting.
35. The proposal will then be presented to the Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting with either the recommendation or without the recommendation of the Directors. After discussion, a majority of the qualified voters will either pass or defeat an amendment or change to the Bylaws or Rules and Regulations.
36. Proposed changes to the Bylaws and to the Rules and Regulations of this Association which have been adopted by the membership at either the Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting, shall not become effective until the following Annual Meeting except in those instances wherein the proposed change (a) contains the phrase "effective immediately" and (b) the proposed change is passed by at least 80% of the voting membership present at the time of the vote.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Article 1 — Membership and Registration

1. A team becomes a member in this Association upon payment of the required registration fee which also includes a membership fee for A.H.A.U.S.
 NOTE: A.H.A.U.S. now provides that teams must register in the District where 80% or more of the members of the organization reside, or the District where the largest number of home games are played. However, A.H.A.U.S. has permitted that where an organizations teams participate in a registered A.A.H.A. District League, and both Districts agree (Registrars of each) Then those teams may register in A.A.H.A.
2. Each team must complete a team registration form in duplicate and file one copy with the District Registrar and one copy with the Secretary of A.A.H.A. All registration checks for A.A.H.A. membership are to be made payable to A.A.H.A.
 NOTE: Teams should declare their classification on their registration forms. Failure to declare a classification will result in an automatic assignment to the Open classification.
3. The annual fees for registered teams and for the membership in general, shall be set annually by the Board of Directors following the Annual A.H.A.U.S. Meeting.
 The fees for the 1980-1981 season shall be:
 - A. House League Teams pay annual dues of \$15.00 (\$10.00 to A.H.A.U.S.)
 - B. Other Teams that do not play before a paid gate, pay annual dues of \$20.00 (\$10.00 to A.H.A.U.S.), plus League Tournament Bound fees.
 - C. Teams that play before a paid gate pay annual dues of \$50.00 (\$25.00 to A.H.A.U.S.). All teams playing before a paid gate must pay the A.H.A.U.S. fee requirement upon registration plus a prescribed percentage of the gross gate.
 - D. ADDITIONAL registered League Tournament Bound fees:
 - Tier I and Junior B — \$50.00 per team
 - Tier II, Junior C, and Girls — \$20.00 per team
4. Membership shall be renewed annually upon receipt of the registration fee and the properly executed form filed with the Registrar.
5. All teams must be registered before the start of league or exhibition games, but in any event not later than December 31st of the playing season to be eligible for District Tournaments.
6. For a team to be in good standing for tournaments, all of its affiliated teams must be registered (this includes House Leagues).
7. A. All teams registered with A.A.H.A. and A.H.A.U.S. must have a coach and/or manager in good standing and these individuals must be indicated appropriately on the registration forms. Coaches and managers must be in good standing. Replacement managers may be registered at a later date.
 B. It is recommended that all coaches achieve the Associate Level and the team choose these coaches whenever there is a choice. The respective leagues are requested to consider mandatory requirements.
8. No team may participate in more than one league.
9. A. Teams must register their players on forms provided by the A.H.A.U.S. District IV Registrar or the Secretary of A.A.H.A. These players forms must include the player's name, birthdate, address, zip code and player's signature and must be forwarded to the respective party. The team coach and/or manager must have birth certificates certified by A.A.H.A. representative, signed by the representative as well as the signature of the coach and/or manager.
 B. "Open Team" rosters are to be published to the Secretary, Zone Sub-Registrars, Credentials Committee, Vice-President and the Tournament Director by January 15. Copies shall be available after January 15 to registered teams upon written request at a fee of \$2.00 to the Registrar.
 C. Rostering shall take place between September 1 and December 31. Any player who (a) signs an official roster form which has been filed with the A.H.A.U.S. Registrar and (b) plays at least one game after the roster has been filed, shall not be permitted to be rostered on another team except upon written release signed by the team coach or manager. Any player who requests a release and is refused has a right of appeal to the Third Vice-President.
 D. It is recommended that each player Junior level and above playing before a paid gate be signed to a playing contract that gives the following information: name of league, date, name, team age classification, season address, telephone number of the player, player's signature, parents signature and space for date of release from

the team with the manager's signature. Also, if possible, it is recommended that a picture of the player be attached to the contract along with a waiver of parental or guardian responsibility.

- E. Only teams playing before a paid gate (Junior, Senior and Intermediate Classed) are permitted to protect their players through the A.H.A.U.S. and A.A.H.A. Protectable players are only those players who were registered and eligible for A.A.H.A. and A.H.A.U.S. tournament play during the preceeding season. Teams must be current with the filing and payment of their paid gate receipts in order to have protected lists honored.
10. For participation in A.A.H.A. or A.H.A.U.S. sponsored tournament leading toward the nationals a player's name may appear on only one official team roster. Teams not submitting rosters by December 31 will be ineligible to participate in the A.A.H.A. or A.H.A.U.S. tournament play leading to the nationals, including zone championships. Postmark on envelope or date on official roster list authenticated by the A.A.H.A. Registrar, will determine submission date.
11. Referees must be registered for A.H.A.U.S. and A.A.H.A. by forwarding their application to the Referee-in-Chief. The Referee Representative serving on the A.A.H.A. Board shall coordinate training clinics with local referees and submit names of qualified referees for District tournaments to the District Tournament Director.
12. The Zone (e.g. league) Referee-in-Chief designations are appointed by the league subject to approval of the A.H.A.U.S. Referee-in-Chief.

Article II – Team Classification

13. Teams in A.A.H.A. shall be classified as follows:
 - A. SENIOR OPEN – Unrestricted as to citizenship and unlimited as to include amateurs and/or reinstated professionals.
 - B. SENIOR U.S. – Restricted to U.S. citizens only, either U.S. born or naturalized with final papers, and limited to amateurs and/or reinstated professionals who have been out of professional hockey at least three seasons.
 - C. INTERMEDIATE U.S. – Restricted to U.S. citizens only, either U.S. born or naturalized with final papers, and limited to amateurs: excluding reinstated professionals.
(SPECIAL NOTE: In all classes below 21 years of age, players who are citizens of the U.S., or who have a resident aliens card are eligible).
 - D. JUNIOR – Limited to amateurs under 20 years of age as of December 31st of the season. Junior B as of September 1st.
 - E. HIGH SCHOOL – Limited to high school students or equivalent age.
 - F. MIDGET – Under 17 years of age as of December 31st of the season.
 - G. BANTAM – Under 15 years of age as of December 31st of the season.
 - H. PEE WEE – Under 13 years of age as of December 31st of the season.
 - I. SQUIRT – Under 11 years of age as of December 31st of the season.
 - J. MITE – Under 9 years of age as of December 31st of the season.
 - K. GIRLS SENIOR – Unlimited age.
 - L. GIRLS MIDGET – Age 19 and under as of December 31st of the season.
 - M. GIRLS PEE WEE – Age 15 & under as of December 31st of the season.
 - N. GIRLS SQUIRT – Age 12 and under as of December 31st of the season.
14. House league teams are teams that play primarily in that one organization's league (i.e., not more than 10 outside games), must have a minimum of 3 teams at any age level, and wherein the players of that organization are distributed among its team for purpose of even competition.
15. Teams who register B are restricted to not more than 30 games prior to the District Tournament.

Article III – Non-Registered Teams

16. A registered team shall not play a non-registered team or a team under suspension by the A.A.H.A. or A.H.A.U.S.
17. Registered teams may play non-registered high school, preparatory or college teams with prior written permission from the Registrar.
18. No teams may play games with Canadian teams unless written permission is secured from the Registrar of the A.A.H.A. This applies to games played in the U.S. as well as those played in Canada.
19. A. Any team violating any of the foregoing rules may be declared ineligible for District play and may be subject to suspension from league competition.
B. Players playing on non-registered teams during a season are ineligible for A.A.H.A. Tournament participation during that season, subject to appeal to the Third Vice-President.

Article IV – Playing Rules (See also by laws Article V jurisdiction)

20. The official A.H.A.U.S. playing Rules shall be used in all classes.
21. All games are under the jurisdiction of A.A.H.A. and must be officiated by A.H.A. U.S. officials.
22. A. All players must wear protective equipment for all games and practices. Equipment must include shin guards, should guards, elbow pads, hip pads or hockey pants, protective cup, gloves, mouth guard, approved skate guards and tendon guards, helmet and protective eyeclasses where needed. All Goalies must wear a fully protective face mask and a full head protector.
NOTE: See A.H.A.U.S. Rulebook, Rule 21 concerning skate guards (Safety tip). Coaches and managers are advised to carry spare guards so every available repair may be made.
B. All players Juniors and below must wear full face mask protection.
NOTE: See A.H.A.U.S. Rule 23 for definition of "full face mask."
23. A team may dress only 18 players and two goalies for any game in this Association, including local league play. Nothing prevents a team from dressing less than the maximum number of players.
24. Score sheets, in quadruplicate, are required for all exhibition games, regular league games and playoff games excluding Mite classification games. One copy of the score sheet to each team and one for the referee.
25. A game shall be defined as follows: When two hockey teams occupy the same ice surface for the purpose of competitive play.
26. All match, gross and game misconducts, intent to injure, deliberate injury, physical abuse or verbal abuse of officials, or team refusal to start or continue to play which, abuse or verbal abuse of officials, or team refusal to start or continue to play which, according to A.H.A.U.S. guide require a 30 day automatic suspension, must be reported upon, in writing, by the game referee to the Third Vice-President within 24 hours of the involved game, and the appropriate league officer.

Article V – Suspensions and Appeals

27. The Third Vice-President shall have the power to suspend any member for conduct detrimental to hockey either on or off the ice. This shall include abusive or threatening words or actions toward an officer, a Director or Game Official of this Association. Appeal from these ruling shall be to the President's Appeals Committee.
28. As soon as is practical under the circumstances, the Third Vice-President shall rule on any offense under Rules 26, 27, 33B, 34, 37 and 38B and advise the party (ies) involved of that ruling, by registered or certified return-receipt requested mail, a copy of said ruling being also sent to the President of A.A.H.A. and to the member organization to which the offending party (ies) are affiliated. Accompanying this ruling will be the advice on the procedures for an appeal to the President's Appeal Committee and for an appeal to the Board of Directors. The report to the President shall have a statement of the findings and facts which served as a basis for the Third Vice-President's rulings.
29. The right of appeal is granted to any player, coach, manager or registered team personnel who is suspended by the District, not merely radified by the District, for any rule infraction or referee's report which results in a period of suspension involving more than 3 games. This appeal, with its' reasons, must be submitted in writing to the President. Decisions will be rendered within two weeks after receipt of the written request of appeal. The decision of the President's committee shall be appealable to the Board of Directors, said appeal to be by written notice to the President of A.A.H.A. within 7 days of receipt of the President's Committee decision. The Board of Directors shall hold its' hearing concerning the appeal within 30 days.
30. A. President's Appeal Committee shall be comprised of the President, Executive Vice-President, Second Vice-President and any other members of the Board deemed appropriate by the President who has not previously ruled on the matter.
B. Appeals to the President's Appeals Committee shall include a \$50 Appeals Fee. Appeals to the Board of Directors shall include a \$100 Appeals Fee. Refunds of these fees may be made if the appeal is upheld and so ordered.
31. All suspensions over 3 games shall be communicated to the President.
32. If a manager, coach or registered member of a team is put out of the game, he or she is automatically suspended for the next game. Further disciplinary action may be taken by the Third Vice-President, if a review of the violation warrants it.

33. A. Any team playing in a league, exhibition or tournament game that leaves the ice during the game shall forfeit the game by a 1-0 score, or by the official score at the time if the team leaving the ice is behind.
B. The coach and/or manager of the team involved in leaving the ice will be subject to a maximum suspension for a period not to exceed one year and a minimum of 30 days.
34. A coach or manager who knowingly allows the participation of an ineligible player in any games shall be subject to suspension for not less than 60 days nor more than one year.
35. A game in order to satisfy a game suspension, qualifies only when the equivalent of two of the three periods (stop time) are played against a team from another organization of the same competitive level. The game must be officiated by A.H.A. U.S. registered officials. Periods defined as in rule 53.
36. In order to preserve as far as possible the integrity of amateur hockey, any recourse to the courts or legal action by a member or individual before all of the right of the Bylaws and Rules and Regulations of this Association shall have been exhausted, shall be ungentlemanly conduct entailing the immediate suspension and disqualification of any such member or individual.

Article VI – Recruiting

37. No coach or manager connected with a registered team may entice, influence or contact a player registered on another registered team without the written approval of the coach and/or manager of that team. Violation of the rule could result in suspension of not less than one year.
38. "Tampering" is to be defined as follows: "Recruiting of a rostered ¹ or protected ² player without prior approval from the organization of the rostered or protected player."

¹ as defined in 9C of A.A.H.A. Guide

² as defined in VIG of A.H.A.U.S. Guide

Penalties:

- A. To the Player: "A rostered or protected player who plays in a game for another organization without prior approval may not play for that other organization for the remaining portion of the current season."
- B. To any others: "Any individual or organization who knowingly tampers is subject to a fine or suspension."

Article VII – Player Awards

39. Hat Trick, Playmaker and Zero Club Awards will be made to those who earn them in regular season games, A.A.H.A. or A.H.A.U.S. sanctioned tournaments, providing the roster of the team has been registered with the A.A.H.A. Secretary. A copy of the referee score sheet must be submitted to the A.A.H.A. office.

Article VIII – District Tournaments

40. Classification for District playoffs are as follows:
A.H.A.U.S. National Tournament Qualifications for Open, Class B & House League.

Eligibility (See also Article I Registration)

41. Girls Midget and below will participate as follows:
(1) OPEN TOURNAMENT – The President shall designate registered leagues as Tier I and Tier II. The Tier I leagues shall send at least one representative. Tier II leagues shall send one representative.
(2) "B" TOURNAMENT – Each "B" league shall send at least one representative.
(3) Tier I League: Atlantic Hockey League
Tier II Leagues: Delaware Valley Hockey League "A" Division
(4) B Leagues: Delaware Valley Hockey League "B" Division
New Jersey Youth Hockey League "B" Division
(5) Girls League: Mid Atlantic Women's Hockey League Reps
(6) Junior C: Two teams each from NJYHL and DVHL
42. Leagues will decide on the method of its selection of team representative for tournament play prior to the start of its league schedule. That method must be communi-

cated, in writing, to the Registrar and President of A.A.H.A. Any changes by the league in the method of its determination must be approved by A.A.H.A.

43. Leagues must declare its representative not later than 10 days prior to the day the first game is scheduled for the District Tournament.
44. The A.A.H.A. District Representative for the Regional and/or National Tournament at the Junior "B" level will be the representative of the Metropolitan Junior Hockey Assn.
45. The A.A.H.A. District Representative for the Regional and/or National Tournament at the Junior "C" level will be the winner of the Junior "C" District Tournament.
46. In order to qualify for tournament play, teams must play at least 20 games and each player 10 games against A.H.A.U.S. registered teams by the beginning of the tournament. A score sheet, signed by a registered referee must be available as proof of the games for the Tournament Committee. The eligible games must be played against teams of another organization at the same or higher competitive level and the equivalent of two periods (stop time) and played as outlined in Rule 54.
47. In any tournament sponsored by A.A.H.A., 50% of the game sheets used as proof to qualify either the team or the individual players must be of games played under A.A.H.A. jurisdiction (i.e., with registered District IV officials).
48. No player can play on more than one National tournament-bound A.H.A.U.S. rostered team.
49. Subject to the Tournament Committee's approval, a team without two goalies may take alternates from their organization or league. If there is no back-up goalie the team may participate with six players until a goalie dresses.
50. "B" and "House League" tournaments may be "limited" or "unlimited". In either case, the maximum number of games permitted for "b" teams is 30.
(1) "Limited" Be and House League tournaments are those wherein the individual team players are not permitted to play with any other team (except that they may play with their own organization's House League).
(2) "Unlimited" B or House League tournaments are those wherein the individual players are permitted to play on more than one team outside the league during the season.
51. a) No player rostered on an A or Open team shall be permitted to participate in a District House League Tournament.
b) In all "B" and "House League" tournaments, individual players must have played in at least 50% of the total number of games played by that team.
c) Leagues will be responsible for verifying that their "B" team tournament representatives have not played more than 30 games.

Playing Rules

52. Tournaments shall be round robin unless only two teams are entered, then 2 out of 3. If more than two teams, the winners and other positions of the round robin tournaments shall be by point scores (2 for winner, 1 for tie). If two or more teams have an equal number of points, their position in the standings will be determined by:
A. The results of the games played between the teams tied in the order –
(1) The points acquired in these games.
(2) Subtracting goals scored against from goals scored in these games. Their position shall be in order of the greatest surplus.
(3) Goals scored against. Their position shall be in order of fewest goals scored.
B. If after applying the formulas of A(1), A(2), A(3), the tie still exists, A(2) and A(3) shall be applied using all the games played by each team.
C. If all the foregoing fails then the teams will be co-champions unless one of the teams must advance to the next level of play. In that event a tie breaking game will be played.

54. No Challenge on player or team eligibility can be made after the first puck is dropped.
55. No game protests are permitted after the score sheet has been signed by the referee.
PROTESTS — Any dispute relating to the interpretation of playing rules shall be dealt with and ruled upon by the Referee-in-Chief in consultation with the designated member of the Protest Committee assigned to that game and in attendance at the moment of the incident. No protest shall be accepted after play has been resumed. The decision of the Referee-in-Chief in attendance will be final. All other protests are ruled upon by the Tournament Committee.
56. If a team fails to appear in time to start the game or does not have sufficient players and does not give notice, the game shall be forfeited provided the other team takes the ice to claim the forfeit. The referee shall be required to give a 10 minute grace period before declaring the forfeiture. In the event of exceptional circumstances the forfeit may be appealed to the Tournament Committee and the game may be ordered replayed if the appeal is upheld.
57. In tournament play, any team forfeiting any of its games will have all of its games stricken for purposes of determining tournament standings.
58. The Tournament Committee shall be responsible for deciding any action (suspensions or otherwise to be taken against a player or team official receiving a match, game misconduct, fighting or gross misconduct penalty). The Tournament Committee shall have full power to waive or increase any suspension. All disciplinary action taken by this Committee shall be reported to the home association of the team(s) involved for further action at their discretion.
59. The only suspension measured in number of games served in this tournament will be those which are earned in this tournament.
60. **REFEREES** — The three man system shall be used. All referees shall be assigned by the Referee-in-Chief (or his appointee) in conjunction with the Tournament Director. The decision of the Referee-in-Chief shall be final. Neither the Referee-in-Chief nor his appointee shall be eligible to officiate any games. The District Referee-in-Chief or his appointee shall be in attendance at all games to supervise the Officials and rule on any protest that relates to the interpretation of the playing rules.
61. All tournament games are under the jurisdiction of A.A.H.A. and must be officiated by A.H.A.U.S. officials.
62. Each team entered in any tournament (District, Regional or National) must be fully uniformed with all players having jerseys of the same color. All players must have a number on his jersey.
63. Designation of the District play-off sites is the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
64. The District, Regional and National Tournaments, and any A.A.H.A. sponsored tournament held in A.A.H.A. shall be under the supervision and control of the Tournament Committee and the Officers of A.A.H.A.
65. **AWARDS** — The Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association shall supply: Individual Awards to both the winner and runner-up team players in each classification participating in the Tournament.
66. The schedule of games shall be set by the Tournament Committee and approved by the A.A.H.A. Tournament Director. It shall be sent to all qualified teams by registered mail no less than five days in advance of the first game. Anyone requesting a change in the schedule must notify the Tournament Director within 24 hours of receipt.
67. There shall be a minimum of four (4) hours between games scheduled on the same day and ten (10) hours between games scheduled on consecutive days. (Time is from the scheduled end of one game and the scheduled beginning of the next game.)
68. In all tournament play held in A.A.H.A. District, the number of games played by one team on one day shall not be more than two with a minimum of four hours between the finish of the first game and the start of the second. No team playing its second game in one day shall be required to play a team playing its first game of the day.
69.
 - a) Teams should have Registrar-Certified copy of roster, their games sheets and birth certificates.
 - b) **INSURANCE** — Each team shall be responsible for providing their own accident insurance for the players. The A.A.H.A. or A.H.A.U.S. or facility hosting the tournament is not responsible for any costs of medical services incurred as a result of a boy being injured while participating in these games.
 - c) **MEDICAL RELEASE FORM** — Each team will provide a duly authorized Medical Release & Hold Harmless Form for each player.
 - d) Game sheets evidencing the teams 20 games and each players 10 games.
70. All District Tournaments must be completed not less than 10 days prior to the first day of the Regional Championships.

71. **COMMITMENT FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP** — Any team entering District Tournament must agree that they will participate in the Regional or National Championships if they should become eligible. Any team not presenting itself for the District, Regional or National Tournaments after becoming qualified shall be subject to suspension. Also, all clubs of this team's organization is subject to being declared ineligible to participate in any District Play-Off the following year.
72. **HOST TEAM** — There shall be no host team named in District Play-Offs.

Article IX — Regional Tournaments

73. If a District Champion is not able to represent A.A.H.A. in a Regional or National Tournament, the runner-up or last eliminated team may be given permission by the Tournament Committee to represent the District.
74. With respect to Regional Tournaments held in our District, they will be hosted by the District and the host team shall be the last eliminated team from the District.

Article X — Invitational Tournaments

75. Any independent or Invitational Tournament held in A.A.H.A. must secure the sanction of A.H.A.U.S. This may be accomplished by filing a copy of the rules and regulations of the tournament with the A.A.H.A. Secretary and the District Registrar. One requirement necessary for A.A.H.A. sanction is that only A.A.H.A. — A.H.A.U.S. and C.A.H.A. registered teams players be allowed to enter or compete in the tournament. Games must be officiated by A.H.A.U.S. officials.
76. No Invitational Tournament shall be sanctioned within a 75 miles radius of a District, Regional or National Tournament on the same weekend.
77. Any registered team or registered player participating in a non-sanctioned A.A.H.A.-A.H.A.U.S. Tournament shall be declared ineligible for the District, Regional and National Play-Offs during the season of such violation.

1979-80 COACHING ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

The second year of the AHAUS Coaching Achievement Program featured an Intermediate Level Coaching Clinic on March 15th, 1980, at the Y.M.C.A. Ice Rink in King of Prussia, Pa.

This was the first Intermediate Clinic held in the United States and it was attended by 109 coaches, all of whom had previously qualified themselves by attending one of the earlier Associate Level Clinics in 1979.

The key speaker at the Intermediate Clinic was Lou Vairo, Coaching Program Director, from AHAUS Headquarters in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The main theme of Vairo's presentation was "Modern American Hockey" which embodied such concepts as (1) playing the "off wing", (2) constant circular skating patterns, (3) new styles of power plays, (4) break-outs and, (5) short handed strategies.

All coaches who attended the Intermediate Clinic and submitted the required essay on "How they intend to use Modern American Hockey concepts in their own Coaching Programs" are now eligible to apply for attendance at an **ADVANCED COACHING CLINIC**, the first of which will be held in Colorado Springs during August 17-22 this year.

As of this writing, May 30, 1980, two hundred hockey coaches in the Mid-Atlantic District have been certified as Associate Coaches and one hundred nine coaches have been certified for the Intermediate Level.

Invitations for the Fall Advanced Level Clinic will be mailed next month from AHAUS headquarters in Colorado Springs and acceptances will be made on a first-come, first-served basis until the clinic quota is filled. Registration fee for the Advanced Clinic is \$50.00 but room and board will be furnished **FREE** at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

It is our intention to continue holding Associate Level clinics during the 1980/81 season to accommodate those coaches who are either new in the AHAUS program or who may have missed out on the earlier clinics given in 1979. There will be **ONE** Intermediate Clinic next season but the time and date are not yet known.

Additionally, there is a strong possibility that Lake Placid will soon be certified as an Olympic Training Center and if that occurs, there will be an **ADVANCED CLINIC** held at that location in February or March of 1981.

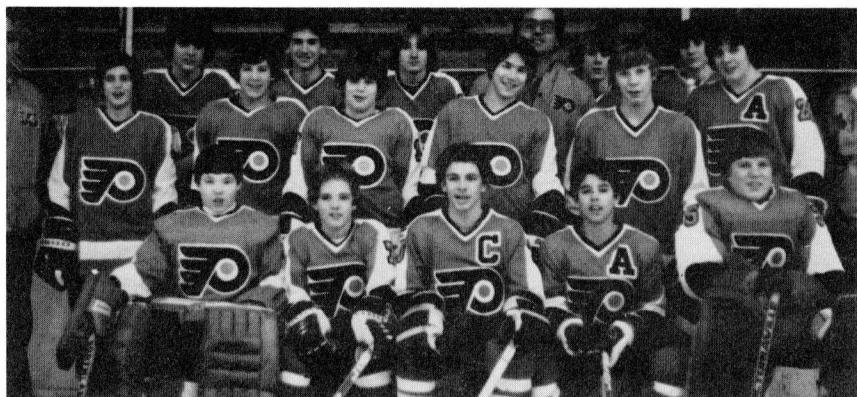

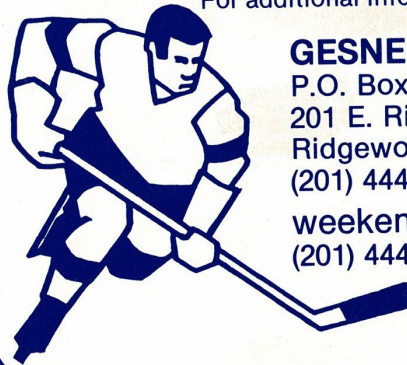
